

The Mornington Wanderers new website has gone live after a complete rebuild by our webmaster, Phil Meredith, to a brand new site. Great work, Phil.


Apart from a completely new look and feel, the new website has a members' only area. This contains the Photo Gallery, Handy Links, along with some old favourites and some new, fun things.


To access the members' area, you will need to register on the website.

- 2. Fill in the registration form details, accept the Terms of Use and submit. The Terms of Use link is at the bottom of every page. (If the registration form fails to submit, please check that all fields have been filled in correctly.)
- 3. Once submitted, your details will be reviewed and authorised if you are a current Ulysses member. You should receive an 'Activate your account' email within 48 hours of registering.
- 4. Click on the 'Activate your account' button/ link and you will now be logged in.

From here, you can view your account profile and select any of the members' area links from the main menu.





Nine Wanderers departed from Pearcedale at the earlier than usual time of O8OO hours to join a group of fellow Ulyssean members for the monthly Ulysses Victorian Breakfast Club (VBC) at Misty Hills Cafe in Neerim South. This was our second branch VBC ride following an unofficial pilot ride to Creswick in August and a September ride to Romsey that Muzz led. The October breakfast was in Wangaratta, but we did not attend.

Paul Butler of the Echuca branch organises these rides with the usual format being a Friday night pub dinner for those doing an overnight trip. The aim of the website is to provide our members with an engaging experience and to have a public presence that we can be proud of.



YOUR ULYSSES MEMBERSHIP HAS ITS PERKS!

Rider training rebates

Ulysses Club membership offers a significant benefit to its members by subsidizing rider-training courses. From 1 January 2024, members are eligible for a subsidy of up to \$100 every three years to participate in a course to update riding skills. This initiative not only promotes safer riding practices,



but also demonstrates the club's commitment to road safety and responsible riding.

The subsidy can be claimed after undertaking the course and a receipt and certificate or letter of completion is required for reimbursement. The course cannot be legally required, eg for obtaining a riding licence.

Check with your insurer prior to the course to make sure any potential incidents are covered under your policy.

A discount on your comprehensive insurance

Some insurers offer a discount on annual premiums because you are a Ulysses member. It's a good idea to check with your insurer, as the amount saved could actually pay for your Ulysses membership.

Want a 4c per litre discount on fuel? Download the United app

For every litre you purchase, you save 2c and the Ulysses' UCARF fund receives 2c. This is now done with the United app for your phone. If you haven't already, download the United app to your smartphone from the Apple app store or Google Play. The app generates a daily barcode which you can use once that day to buy discounted fuel.





INAUGURAL 'RIDE FOR RHEUMATOID'

The inaugural 'Ride for Rheumatoid' will start in Melbourne on **Sunday, 16 March** and finish in Armidale NSW on **Sunday, 23 March 2025** in time for the 2025 National Rally. The aim of the ride is to raise funds for UCARF. The cost to participate is a \$20 per day/part day or \$100 for the full ride (approx. 2,160km).

The ride will leave Melbourne's Monash Uni and travel via Geelong, Ballarat, Bendigo, **Echuca**, Albury, **Wagga Wagga**, Canberra, **Wollongong**, Campbelltown, **Newcastle**, **Port Macquarie**, Tamworth, and finally to **Armidale** where members are welcome to join the rally. Place names in bold are the overnight stops, which will be at local caravan parks or hotels (yet to be organised). The other towns are the lunch stops.

At each stop, local branches will support the ride by meeting the riders at their stop, promoting UCARF, running raffles, engaging people and, importantly, raising funds. It's hoped the branches will also encourage members to join, sponsor riders and generally raise awareness.

Branch members and others can join for either the whole or part of the ride. The cost to participate is a \$20 per day/part day or \$100 for the full ride.


